### VETERINARIAN/CLIENT/PATIENT RELATIONSHIP

Veterinarian/client/patient relationship (VCPR) is the relationship between a veterinarian and their client meaning the veterinarian knows and regularly sees the animals being treated. The individual responsible for authorizing medical treatment for those animals agrees to follow the veterinarian's instructions.
